Directors report - 2020/21

April 2020 to March 2021 was an extraordinary year for many reasons. As the world adjusted to the impacts of a global pandemic, GM Freeze started the year with our own financial crisis and the threat of imminent closure. Our supporters rose to the occasion with generous donations and, as a result, we are delighted to report on a full year packed with activity and plans for much more.

In a year that saw the end of the Brexit transition period and unprecedented efforts to undermine key GM safeguards we worked towards the five strategic priorities agreed in 2019. Recognising the turbulent times in which we live, our strategy is consciously flexible – allowing the team to focus on what most needs doing from one month to the next, while always reaching towards our vision of a world in which everyone's food is produced responsibly, fairly and sustainably.

Directors' Report

Strategic aim 1:

We will <u>OPPOSE</u> the cultivation, import, production and sale of GM crops, seed, animal feed and food in the UK, by influencing policy and regulation of all forms of genetic engineering in food and farming.

This year saw a concerted political effort to remove key GM safeguards and open the UK's door to GMOs created with highly experimental new genome editing techniques. First came an attempt to amend the Agriculture Bill to give Ministers the power to decide what does – and does not – count as a GMO in English law. We worked intensively with colleagues at Beyond GM and GM Watch to engage a wide range of organisations and individuals in opposing this outrageous move. The amendment was withdrawn but only after the Government promised a public consultation on deregulating gene editing in food and farming.

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra)'s Consultation on the Regulation of Genetic Technologies (as it became) launched on 7 January, closed to submissions on 17 March and dominated our work in the final quarter of 2020/21. We again teamed up with colleagues in other organisations (particularly Beyond GM – see Strategic Aim 4, below) and work included an extensive guide to support public submissions, a fully referenced political briefing, an Early Day Motion developed with and proposed by Caroline Lucas MP, parliamentary questions and, of course, our own submission to the consultation. The Government's response to the consultation was announced in Autumn 2021 and will influence our work throughout 2021/2.

Strategic aim 2:

While GM is present in UK food and farming, we will campaign for greater <u>TRANSPARENCY</u> and support people's right to make informed choices about what they buy, use and eat.

With this year's strong focus on defending key GM safeguards, we made the case time and again for informed choice. Our Don't Hide What's Inside petition continued to demonstrate that the UK public wants to keep our GM labels and the role of GM labelling featured heavily in our response to Defra's consultation, as detailed under Strategic Aim 1, above.

The Brexit transition period ended on 31 December 2020 and we analysed the overlapping impacts of new legislation, trade deals, the Northern Ireland protocol and devolution to Scotland and Wales – all of which will affect which GMOs are allowed into our food and how easily we will be able to choose whether or not to buy and eat them. New civil service teams were given responsibilities previously held in Brussels and we organised private meetings with the Food Standards Agency, Food Standards Scotland, officials at Defra and more.

Strategic aim 3:

We will change the <u>NARRATIVE</u> and win public support by effectively presenting the evidence-based case against GM across a range of channels and audiences.

In April we received a grant from the Network for Social Change to support a new **PROJECT: We've Been Framed**. We brought a group of key campaigners and civil society representatives together to learn about the unhelpful ways that discussion around GM is framed. We identified new, more effective ways to talk about why GM has no place in a responsible, fair and sustainable food system. Our findings were shared at the ORFC Global conference, and we continue to develop and share resources at www.gmfreeze.org/framed as well as building key lessons into our own external communications.

Media interest in GM in food and farming was higher this year than in the recent past and GM Freeze was quoted in many articles across national newspapers, trade press and news websites. Our Director appeared on BBC Radio 4's Farming Today programme five times and extended our reach with appearances on RT UK (Russia Today's English language TV channel), Voice of Islam radio and BBC Radio Ulster. Links to media coverage that we are aware of are published in the News section of our website www.gmfreeze.org.

Strategic aim 4:

We will provide an <u>UMBRELLA</u> to support and build the network of organisations, campaigners and individuals that share our vision of a GM-free food and farming system.

Our Esmée Fairbairn Foundation-funded **PROJECT: Creating a new GM Regulation Coalition** continued this year with a careful analysis of what it would take to get an effective new coalition off the ground. We concluded that, while effective high-profile work to uphold and develop GM regulation is essential in the short to medium-term future, a new coalition is not the way to make that happen. Collaboration and shared working are essential to the task of safeguarding our food and our farms, but we need a much more nimble and responsive approach that can adapt to the rapid and ongoing political, scientific and industrial changes in this area. We shared our conclusions with the funder and are pleased to report (Looking Ahead, below) that they have put their faith in our approach.

We developed and are delivering a new **PROJECT: Safeguarding Agroecology** in close partnership with the independent campaigning initiative Beyond GM. Generously funded by the Farming the Future collective, this project supported our response to Defra's pivotal consultation (see Strategic Aim 1, above) and focuses more broadly on building a coherent civil society response to the risks that gene editing poses to agroecological farming.

Strategic aim 5:

We will IMPROVE our own effectiveness as an organisation.

We started this financial year with an appeal for funds, and a need to raise £25,000 to avoid closure. The response from our supporters was phenomenal, with over £37,000 received from generous individuals throughout the year – a more than four-fold rise on the previous year. Alongside small core grants from JMG Foundation and the A Team Foundation (together with project grants noted above), the new income allowed us to operate at full capacity throughout the year.

LOOKING AHEAD

As noted last year, the fluctuating interests of grant funders presents a great challenge to expert issue-based campaigning organisations like GM Freeze. The phenomenal response to our appeal shows just how much our supporters value our work but their donations were given (quite reasonably!) on a one-off basis. For GM Freeze to continue, we need a more sustainable funding plan.

We are delighted to report that, in June 2021, Esmée Fairbairn Foundation granted GM Freeze a two-year funding award that will cover more than half our current running costs. This is a hugely important award and will allow us to work in a focused but flexible way to support the food, farming and environmental sectors to better understand and make the case for effective UK regulation of agricultural GMOs. However, we are not sitting on our laurels and the Management Committee continues to consider radical options for changing what GM Freeze does and how we do it.

COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic and the public health measures established to manage its impact affected us all, but GM Freeze suffered less disruption than most. Our staff team are largely based at home, and we have long used online meeting platforms, so we adjusted quickly. Our Director temporarily reduced her working hours to balance family demands in the early months of this financial year and we worked to support each other as best we could. We have missed getting out and seeing our members and supporters face to face but used temporary legal arrangements to hold our 2020 AGM online. That meeting accepted a motion to amend our Articles of Association so that all General Meetings may now be held online or in person with equal status. We established a detailed COVID-19 risk assessment in April 2020 and mitigation measures are regularly reviewed by the Management Committee.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the sale of goods and from the rendering of services. Turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have transferred to the buyer. Turnover from the rendering of services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs.

Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price), less any impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts. Loans and other financial assets are initially recognised at transaction price including any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price). Loans and other financial liabilities are initially recognised at transaction price net of any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method.

Taxation

A current tax liability is recognised for the tax payable on the taxable profit of the current and past periods. A current tax asset is recognised in respect of a tax loss that can be carried back to recover tax paid in a previous period. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences between the recognition of income and expenses in the financial statements and their inclusion in tax assessments. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference, except for revalued land and investment property where the tax rate that applies to the sale of the asset is used. Current and deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Pensions

Contributions to defined contribution plans are expensed in the period to which they relate.
